Topic: Celebrations

Literacy

Our core texts for this half term are 'The Little Red Hen' and 'The Leaf Thief' by Alice Hemming.



We will also be reading a variety of fiction and non-texts around different celebrations. We will be writing lists, labels and speech bubbles using the sounds we have learnt in our phonics lesson.



As storytellers we will sequence stories and retell them in the correct order.

Maths

In maths we will be exploring the composition of numbers up to 5. We will explore finding different representations of 1,2,3,4,5 and children will be encouraged to use counting principles such as touching an object as they count to support one-toone correspondence. We will be sharing stories and pictures which show numbers up to 5. The children will be given practical opportunities to explore a range of ways to partition a whole number into two parts and to find different ways, for example, 4 can be composed of 2 and 2 or 3 and 1.



We will be looking at 2D flat shapes like circles, triangles, squares and rectangles. The children will be finding and comparing these shapes using the language like 'sides', 'straight' and 'corners.'


